#### State of the Third: A Midterm Review

Last Sunday evening, I attended the CD3 Midterm Review presented by Councilwoman Suzie Price at the LB Museum of Art. The review highlighted many of the CD3 projects, initiatives and accomplishments over the past two years. The 3rd and 4th council districts share a 4-mile border along Atherton St., Clark Ave., Anaheim St., Ximeno Ave. and 10th St. Many of our neighborhoods share common issues including CSULB parking impacts, airport noise, RV parking and traffic impacts.

Community Watch is a crime prevention program that involves individual groups working with the police to affect crime. Crime prevention resources are available online regarding current crime trends, crime prevention, and safety techniques. Community Watch encourages participants to keep a watchful eye, not only on the block where they live but the community as



a whole, and report suspicious and potential criminal behavior. Community Watch begins with a block approach and expands to include others in the surrounding area and scope of influence. Participants are encouraged to reach out to businesses, nearby schools, and non-profit organizations to get to know each other and communicate.

Enjoy a FREE family fun event at Bixby Elementary tonight. There will be a live concert by acclaimed kid friendly



On June 2, 2016, the LB Board of Water Commissions declared a Stage 1 water supply shortage (rescinding the Stage 2) that permitted outdoor watering three days per week. However, the Stage 1 designation also stipulates that watering must revert back to two days per week from October 1st through March 31st. #### **JetBlue Fined \$24,300 for September Noise Violations**

We still have one night left in September, but we thought we would give you a sneak peek at anticipated results. Preliminary numbers (subject to verification) show that JetBlue conducted seven operations after 11:00 pm. Four of these operations resulted in Consent Decree violations. For the month of September, each Consent Decree fine resulted in a fine of \$6,000. JetBlue conducted a total of 10 operations in between 10:00 pm and 11:00 pm. Nine of these operations qualified as unanticipated delays and the delays were primarily due to mechanical problems with aircraft and poor weather conditions. One operation that was conducted in between 10:00 pm and 11:00 pm resulted in a \$300 violation. JetBlue was fined a total of \$24,300 for the month of September. Thanks, as always, to LGB Airport Operations Specialist - Noise Analyst II, Ryan McMullen, for his timely data analysis. We should be receiving the quarterly noise violation report in a couple of weeks.




