City Council to Vote on Appointment of Tom Modica

A City of Long Beach press release was issued this afternoon stating that City Council will vote next Tuesday on the appointment of Acting City Manager, Thomas B. Modica, as City Manager. Tom has worked for the City for 18 years in a number of positions, and he was appointed Assistant City Manager in 2014. You can read the entire press release at this Link.



Community Hospital Update

Wednesday night, the City issued a press release titled: City of Long Beach Provides Update on Hospital Capacity and Supplies. It contained a lot of information about CHLB including the following paragraph. "For the past two weeks, Community Hospital staff, at Gov. Gavin Newsom's request, has worked with the City and the State to prepare the hospital to provide



additional beds and resources in response to the COVID-19 epidemic. The hospital has worked in partnership with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) to prepare the hospital for licensure. As of the CDPH's last visit on April 4, hospital officials are expecting the contract and license will be approved within the next few days." You can read the entire press release at this link.

COVID-19 Updates

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

By the Numbers (Long Beach only):

- 316 positive results, including 41 Long Beach residents who are hospitalized and approximately 140* cases where people have recovered.
- 68 positive cases have been confirmed at six <u>long-term</u> care facilities in Long Beach.
- One more death has been reported, bringing the total to nine. The individual was a man in his 50s, with underlying health conditions.
- Details re: fatalities
 - All had underlying health conditions
 - Of the nine, six are associated with long-term care facilities
 - Two victims were in their 50s, two were in their 60s, and five were over 80 years old
 - Three victims were men and six were women
 - At this time, to avoid risk to patient privacy, no further details will be provided

*Please note that, for low-risk patients recovering at home, recovery data is self reported. The City will update this number to the best of its ability, but can only provide an approximate total.

This Week's Highlights:

- More than 170 Long Beach Animal Care shelter cats and dogs have found homes during the COVID-19 pandemic. Read the press release.
- The City <u>provided guidance</u> for residents who opt to wear face coverings in public.
- On April 6, the City of Long Beach<u>launched a Rapid Assessment Clinic</u> to provide medical assistance to people who might otherwise feel compelled to visit an emergency room for their medical conditions.
- The <u>Rapid Assessment Clinic</u> located at the Long Beach City College Pacific Coast Campus is closing early - at 2:00 p.m. instead of it's normal time of 6:00 p.m. - on Sunday in observance of the Easter holiday.
- The five firefighters who are Long Beach residents and tested positive for COVID-10 have all recovered and cleared to go back to work.
- On April 9, the California National Guard approved the City of Long Beach's request to provide logistical support for humanitarian assistance related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Fifty members of the National Guard 315th Company are expected to arrive in the city on April 10, 2020 and will remain available in this initial deployment thru June 30, 2020.
- All Long Beach parks, including open spaces, will be closed on Easter Sunday, April 12, to prevent the spread of COVID-19. City sports facilities and beaches were <u>closed last month</u> in accordance with the <u>"Safer at Home"</u> order. The closure



includes spaces for passive recreational activities and active uses such as walking, running and biking. Please observe closure signage posted at all parks.

Tracking the Curve

A City analyst has been assigned to work on data to enable the Health
Department's Communicable Disease Control Program (CDCP) to focus on
outbreak response. The analyst will work with CDCP to launch a new data
dashboard next week. Thanks for bearing with us as we continue to work on
giving you the best, and most complete, data possible

The Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health (LACDMH) supports the wellbeing of our

The suspension of street sweeping parking citations has been extended through May 1, 2020. Street sweeping will continue in areas where the sweeper can effectively provide service, however no citations will be issued to violating vehicles. While citations will not be issued, the City encourages the community to move their vehicles during posted sweeping times. Street sweeping is a critical health service for the City, collecting thousands of tons of debris each year, therefore it is essential that vehicle owners make every effort to comply with parking restrictions. All other parking enforcement, including metered parking, time zones, and red, white and blue curbs, will continue as usual.

Caltrans Completes Traffic Circle Redesign

Last Friday night, Caltrans District 7 completed the Traffic Circle safety enhancement project that included repaving, re-striping of lanes, improved signage and new drainage. The Caltrans aerial photos below show the changes to each of the elevated triangular islands around the circle. The islands, called "pork chops", have been elongated with paint striping to create a tighter angle that encourages drivers to turn and look for oncoming traffic. There has also been a reduction in the total number of traffic lanes. We'll have to wait until after the "safer at home" order has been lifted to see how normal traffic volumes are impacted by the changes.







Recount for Sales Tax Ballot Measure A

As announced by the Los Angeles Registrar Recorder/County Clerk on March 27th, Measure A passed by a margin of 16 votes out of 99,336 votes cast. The measure extends the City of Long Beach's Transactions and Use Tax beyond 2027. On Wednesday, City Clerk Monique DeLaGarza issued a memo stating that, in accordance with Section 15620 of the California



Elections Code, a written request has been filed by a registered voter requesting a recount of ballots cast for the City of Long Beach - Measure A Election, held with the March 3, 2020, Presidential Primary Election. The recount began April 8, 2020 at 10:00 a.m., at the Offices of Los Angeles Registrar Recorder/County Clerk and will continue daily until completed or otherwise directed. That is all the official information we've received from our City Clerk. While the recount process just beginning, it appears to be evolving rapidly. We should have much more information to share next week.

L.A. County Property Taxes Due TODAY April 10th Deadline: April 10, 2020 | https://www.propertytax.lacounty.gov/

If you're wondering if the deadline to pay property taxes will be extended due to COVID-19, the answer is no. According to Keith Knox, Treasurer and Tax Collector, Los Angeles County has no authority to extend the deadline as outlined by State Law. However, property owners affected by COVID-19 may submit a request to have late penalties waived. You can read the entire statement by Keith Knox at this link.

Next on the Council Agenda April 14th | 5 pm | Teleconference

The City Council teleconference will start at 5 pm. The civic chambers will be closed, but the public can use eComment to provide comments on agenda items. Comments can also be submitted by email to: CityClerk@longbeach.gov

- Recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund Group in the Economic Development Department in the amount of \$250,000, offset by the Fourth Council District One-time District Priority Funds transferred from the General Fund Group in the Citywide Activities Department to support elevator repairs at Community Hospital of Long Beach; and Decrease appropriations in the General Fund Group in the Citywide Activities Department by \$250,000 to offset a transfer to the Economic Development Department.
- Recommendation to request City Manager to work with all other appropriate
 departments, to evaluate the feasibility of implementing a temporary suspension
 of the Proactive Rental Housing Inspection Program (PRHIP) and business
 licensing renewal fees for residential rental property owners and commercial
 property owners impacted by the COVID-19;
- Recommendation to declare ordinance amending the Long Beach Municipal Code by adding Chapter 8.100, to temporarily prohibit evictions due to COVID-19 through May 31, 2020; declaring the urgency thereof; and declaring that this ordinance shall take effect immediately, read and adopted as read. (Ordinance No. ORD-20-0010). (Citywide)
