Past and Ongoing Events

College Estates Neighborhood "Lake Stevely" Update

As reported last week, on July 4th, College Estates neighbors from the 800 to 1100 block of Stevely Street awakened to a 400 yard by 40 yard lake in the LA Dept. of Water & Power easement behind their homes. A 12-inch water main had burst, and 500,000 gallons of potable water leaked into the LADWP



transmission right of way (ROW) within two hours. Neighbors contacted our council office, and we reached out to the LADWP and Greater LA County Vector Control District. The water was treated for mosquitoes by GLACVCD and pumped out of the ROW by LADWP. Thanks both agencies for responding and resolving the issues. You can read LADWP's full action plan <u>here</u>. Long Beach Women's Fair

Before Tuesday's City Council Meeting, my family and I attended the first Long Beach Women's Fair at the Civic Center. The fair was a celebration for the 100th anniversary of the Equal Rights Amendment and the women and girls of Long Beach. The event included tables from community groups and special guest speakers. There was live music, poetry and cookies from Willmore Bakery. The celebration was followed by a report from the Office of Equity on the community survey regarding the Commission on Women and Girls. In addition, the Council took a unanimous vote to direct the City Attorney to bring forth the first reading of an Ordinance establishing a Commission on Women and Girls. Thank you to the Long Beach Suffrage 100 for allowing me to be a proud sponsor of this event.



SAFER Grant Continues E17 Restoration

Tuesday night, City Council approved the acceptance of the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant. This will provide funding of over \$3 million to secure the hiring of seven firefighters over the next three years. As previously determined by City Council, the funds will be used to keep Fire Engine 17 in service. on a gasoline taker fire at Bellflower and Stearns, taking immediate action, and avoiding what could have been disastrous consequences.





LBFD's John Davis Appointed Assistant Chief

On July 11, 2023, Long Beach Fire Department Chief Dennis Buchanan announced the appointment of Assistant Chief John Davis as the newest member of the Long Beach Fire Department Command Staff. He has contributed to our newsletter in the past year, and in 2015, he was featured in a story about the gasoline tanker fire at the Bellflower & Stearns Mobil station. Below is the article that appeared in our 10/23/15 newsletter. Please take the time to watch the video. Thank you to the crew from Fire Station 22

On October 22, 2015, we were able to arrange a follow-up visit from Engine 22 to the scene of







the 10/16/15 Mobil Station tanker fire. Station owner Bill Stephens and I got the opportunity to thank the crew for saving the day (and Bill's gas station). Fire Captain John Davis shared details on how they rolled up on an incredibly dangerous situation and took immediate and decisive actions that quickly knocked down a fire of catastrophic potential. Attached is a link to the video where Capt. Davis describes arriving on scene of a gasoline tanker fire where the entire cab was engulfed in flames and a tire had already exploded. In addition to Station 22's crew, others at the "reunion" from the LBFD were Fire Chief Mike DuRee, Deputy Chief Mike Sarjeant, Battalion Chief Xavier Espino, Administrative Bureau Manager David Honey and Long Beach Firefighter's Association President, Rex Pritchard.
