

#### 405 Freeway Express Lanes Open to Open Next Friday

Opening December 1st | I-405 from I-605 to CA-73

The new 405 Freeway Express Lanes are scheduled to open on December 1st. The lanes will extend over the 14-mile stretch from Long Beach to Costa Mesa. The system will utilize electronic tolling to keep traffic flowing, and there will be no cash payments or toll booths. FasTrak transponders will be required for customers to use the express lanes. If you have an existing transponder and active account from any toll agency in California, there's nothing more needed to use the 405 Express Lanes. # And Finally....

## **Native American Heritage Day and Month**

On this Native American Heritage Day, Long Beach can reflect on its celebration of Native American Heritage Month. Specific to Council District 4, we hosted our annual Native American Celebration at City Hall and continued our progress on creating a Long Beach Native American Commission. CD4 is home to the Puvungna sacred site adjacent to the CSULB campus, and Native American celebration events took place on the campus during November. Rancho Los Alamitos, also in CD4, has created an audio tour focusing on Puvungna that is available here.



Long Beach is also home to Will Rogers Middle School. Many are not aware that Will Rogers, the vaudeville performer, actor, radio star, syndicated columnist and humorous social commentator, was a Native American. He was born in 1879 as a citizen of the Cherokee Nation in Oologah, Indian Territory (now Oklahoma). His story is part of my presentation at Sunnyside Cemetery each year at my grandparent's grave. My grandfather was born in 1878 in Skiatook, Indian Territory, on the Osage Reservation just 20 miles west of the Rogers' home. There is 98-year-old quote from Will Rodgers that perfectly summarizes why we celebrate Native American Heritage today. When asked for proof that he was an American in order to obtain a passport (ironically to travel to Europe) he responded, "My ancestors didn't get here on the Mayflower, but they did meet the boat when it arrived".
