


LBFD & LBPD Toy Patrol Holiday Drive



The City Council meeting will start at 5:00 pm in the Civic Chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 411 W. - C-14: Recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department by \$3,675, offset by Fourth Council District One-Time District Priority Funds, transferred from the Citywide Activities Department, to provide support for the following: Long Beach Latino Employees Organization Inc. in support of their annual Churro Run in the amount of \$265; Care Closet in support of their ongoing efforts to assist people experiencing homelessness in the amount of \$2,500; The Belmont Shore Business Association in support of their annual community holiday parade in the amount of \$450; Leadership Long Beach Inc in support of their annual MLK Day of Service in the amount of \$1,000; and Decrease appropriations in the General Fund Group in the Citywide Activities Department by \$3,675, to offset a transfer to the City Manager Department.
- R-45: Recommendation to adopt resolution condemning all forms of racism, religious or ethnic bias, discrimination, incitement of violence, and hate crimes, and affirming the City's values of inclusivity, diversity, equity, and acceptance in relation to public meetings.




40th Annual Belmont Shore Christmas Parade

And Finally...

Native American Heritage Day and Month

On this Native American Heritage Day, Long Beach can reflect on its historical celebrations of Native American Heritage. Specific to Council District 4, we are home to the Puvungna sacred site adjacent to the CSULB campus. Native American celebrations take place on the campus each March with the CSULB Pow Wow. Rancho Los Alamitos, also in CD4, has created an audio tour focusing on Puvungna that is available here.



Long Beach is also home to Will Rogers Middle School. Many are not aware that Will Rogers, the vaudeville performer, actor, radio star, syndicated columnist

and humorous social commentator, was Native American. He was born in 1879 as a citizen of the Cherokee Nation in Oologah, Indian Territory (now Oklahoma). His story is part of my presentation at Sunnyside Cemetery each year at my grandparent's grave. My grandfather was born in 1878 in Skiatook, Indian Territory, on the Osage Reservation just 20 miles west of the Rogers' home. There is 99-year-old quote from Will Rogers that perfectly summarizes why we celebrate Native American Heritage today. When asked for proof that he was an American in order to obtain a passport (ironically to travel to Europe) he responded, "My ancestors didn't get here on the Mayflower, but they did meet the boat when it arrived".
