In Memorium: Fire Chief Harold Omel, Jr.

It is with profound sadness that we share news of the passing of Harold Omel, Jr., one of the most influential leaders in our city's history. Harold served as the President of the Long Beach Firefighters Association for 22 years prior to serving as LBFD's Fire Chief. He was a product of our 4th council district having grown up on Cervato Street in the Artcraft Manor/Stearns Park neighborhood. He was also a member of Millikan High School's original graduating class. I had the honor of closing Tuesday's city council meeting in his memory. Our deepest condolences are extended to Harold's wife Patti, the entire Omel family and to all the firefighters who were blessed to have benefitted from his lifetime of service.





El Dorado Park & Nature Center Now Cashless

The City of Long Beach Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine (PRM) is following the practice of the National Park System and moving to cashless park entry for El Dorado East Regional Park and El Dorado Nature Center. Cashless entry reduces transaction times at park entry stations, improves accountability and consistency and reduces chances of errors. Effective immediately, entry booths at these locations will only accept cashless payment options including debit, credit, prepaid credit cards and smart pay. Park patrons who do not have access to cashless payment options



may purchase day tickets at the El Dorado East Regional Park Office or El Dorado Nature Center Visitors Center located directly inside the parks' entries. Find more information at this <u>link</u>.

Proposed Solid Waste & Recycling Rate Increase


The City of Long Beach Department of Public Works is planning rate adjustments to account for the introduction of residential organics collection in compliance with Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383). A Proposition 218 public hearing to review the proposed rate adjustment will be held on Tuesday, March 11, 2025, at 3:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. A memo was also mailed to residents last week, and can be read at this link. Residents can submit protests by mail or online at this link. 


El Dorado Park East Road Repave Project

The City Council meeting will start at 5:00 pm in the Civic Chambers on the ground floor of City Hall, located at 411 W. - H-21: Recommendation to receive supporting documentation into the record, conclude the public hearing, review and determine that the proposed Long Beach Municipal Code (LBMC) amendments and Local Coastal Program Amendment (LCPA) exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 21166, 15162, 15163 and 15061 (b)(3) of the State CEQA Guidelines; Declare ordinance adopting Zoning Code Amendment (ZCA24-003) and the proposed findings related thereto, to amend Chapter 21.67 of the Zoning Regulations to expand the existing Inclusionary Housing Ordinance applicability beyond the Downtown Plan (PD-30) and Mid-Town Specific Plan (SP-1) submarkets and apply the ordinance citywide, including sites within the coastal zone; change the affordability requirements for Inclusionary Housing units; and implement other changes to the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance, read the first time and laid over to the next regular meeting of the City Council for final reading;
- R-29: Recommendation to adopt Plans and Specifications No. R-7230 and award a
 contract to Best Contracting Services, Inc. of Gardena, CA for the construction of the Main
 Health Critical Facility Improvements Project, in the amount of \$5,760,870, authorize a 20

percent contingency in the amount of \$1,152,174, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$6,913,044; and, authorize City Manager, or designee, to execute all documents necessary to enter into the contract, including any necessary subsequent amendments. (District 4)

 O-30: Recommendation to declare ordinance amending and restating Chapter 5.77 of the Long Beach Municipal Code relating to short-term rentals, read and adopted as read. (Citywide)

And Finally...

Bixby Hill Water Main Break Causes Widespread Damage

For the second week in a row, we've preempted our regularly scheduled "And Finally" feature to bring you breaking news. Early this morning, I began receiving calls from Bixby Hill neighbors reporting a water main break that happened in the 4am hour. The good news is that break was contained at 8:30 am, and now the cleanup efforts are commencing. Check out the attached photos and video that tell the story.

From the Long Beach Fire Department:

This morning, around 4:30 AM, #YourLBFD responded to the 700 block of Rancho Drive. @longbeachfirefighters requested @lbutilities to assist with a possible water main break. By 6:30 AM, swiftwater teams were deployed to assist two residents in safely leaving their home. At 8:23 AM, Water crews have contained the large main break. We are aware of one additional area where water is still flowing, though it is significantly less. Crews are working on emergency repairs.




